Must Do:

Go back and look at your assignments to make sure they are complete. Fix spelling errors, and correct poor handwriting.
Complete vocabulary assignments including writing sentences with key vocabulary and recording interesting words from the chapters. Pick a few interesting words to look up in the dictionary!
Read an article that is related to the book you are reading. Complete any assignments your teacher has given to go with the article.
Pick a favorite part of the book that you would like to read out loud to a friend. (Select a passage that is about 1 page or 200 words.) Take time to practice reading the passage smoothly and with good expression. After practicing several times, get together with your friend and tell him/her a little bi about your book. Then have your friend rate you on how well you read.
 Did you read smoothly? Did you read with good expression? Did you read at a good rate—not too fast and not too slow? Answer any questions your friend has about your book.
