San Diego Quick Assessment

This test measures the recognition of words out of context using word lists from preprimer to eleventh grade. At the beginning of the year, use your grade-level word list as a screener.

This assessment should be delivered one-on-one, in a quiet room or hallway. The assessment will take 2-5 minutes per student when administered as a screener. Follow these directions for administering the assessment:

- Provide the grade-level word list and ask the student to read the words.
- Wait 5-seconds before moving to the next word.
- Mark words read correctly with a check.
- All other words are considered miscues.
- Mispronunciations can be written next to the word.
- Words skipped can be crossed out.

Use the following chart to determine whether the student is below, on, or above-grade level:

More than 2 errors.	Exactly 2 errors.	Less than 2 errors.

Consider retesting your students who are below and on-grade level to determine whether the skills acquired have led to growth.

If you would like to test to the student's *instructional reading level*, rather than using the assessment as a screener, use the other grade-level word lists. When the student makes exactly 2 errors, that word list is at their instructional level.

When using data from standardized tests to sort students into groups, consider these book placements to be tentative. Further experience with students might cause you to move them up to a more challenging text or down to an easier book. Remember, these tests are fallible, so decisions should be supported by other evidence and teacher judgment. It is not just the level of the book that matters, but its structure, organization, and complexity. When in doubt about a student's book placement, a running record will provide additional information.
